## **MARKET SNAPSHOT**



#### Market This Week: 21 Nov 2025

Indian Indices: Indian markets were mixed. Nifty 50 closed at 26,068.15 (+0.61%) and Sensex at 85,231.92 (+0.79%).

Broader markets weakened—BSE 500 (-0.15%), Nifty 500 (-0.19%), Midcap 100 (-0.76%), and Smallcap 100 (-2.22%).

Nifty Next 50 saw a sharp decline of -1.60%.

Global Indices: Global markets saw heavy selling. S&P 500 (-2.90%), Dow Jones (-2.96%), Nasdaq (-3.59%), Nikkei (-3.32%), and Hang Seng (-4.61%) all ended sharply lower.

Sectors: Gainers were IT (+1.61%), Auto (+1.09%), Consumption (+0.90%), Bank (+0.60%), and Infra (+0.44%).

Losers included FMCG (-0.10%), Pharma (-1.05%), Energy (-1.13%), and Realty (-3.78%) (worst performer).

Currency: Rupee remained stable. USD/INR at ₹88.66 (-0.11%); GBP/INR at ₹116.00 (-0.62%).

Volatility: India VIX jumped +14.15%, and CBOE VIX surged +33.23%, reflecting heightened uncertainty.

Economic Data (Nov 2025): Inflation at 0.25%, Repo 5.50%, Unemployment 5.20%, GDP growth 7.80%, G-Sec Yield 6.54%.

Market Cap-to-GDP: India stands at 142%, below USA (213%) and Japan (194%), but above China (74%) and Germany (53%).

- India's exports fell 11.8% to \$34.4B we sold less.
- Imports jumped 16.6% to \$76.1B, mainly due to gold and silver.
- Since imports were significantly higher, the trade deficit shot up to \$41.7B.
- Experts say this big gap can
   strain India's financial balance.
- With global demand weak, exports may stay slow.



- Unemployment stayed at 5.2% no big change.
- Rural joblessness fell because farm work improved.
- Urban unemployment rose due to slow hiring in services.
- More people started looking for jobs labour force participation went up to 55.4%.
- Youth unemployment dropped a little, showing early improvement.

- New tax rules will shape state spending.
- Better state finances = stronger growth.
- Not a big short-term market mover.
- Long-term outlook stays stable and positive.





#### Will US Peace Efforts Tip Oil Into Oversupply?



- Oil prices went up a little after a small drop.
- US peace
   efforts may
   lead to more oil
   supply in the
   future.
- US oil
   stockpiles fell a
   lot, which
   normally
   supports higher
   prices.
- More refining and exports increased demand for US oil.
- Overall, the market may move sideways because signals are mixed.



- Oil may stay range-bound in the short term.
- Mixed supply-demand signals → no big trend yet.
- Watch global geopolitics for the next move.
- Not a major long-term concern for diversified investors.





#### Have Silver ETFs and FoFs Taken the Lead Over Physical Silver?



- Silver funds are outperforming physical silver across all time frames.
- Rising demand and limited supply support a positive price outlook.
- Ideal for investors seeking momentum + commodity diversification.

- Over the last 3 years,
   Silver ETFs/FoFs gave
   better returns than
   buying physical silver.
- In the past 1 year, silver funds returned 50%+, slightly more than physical silver's ~49%.
- In the last 3-6 months, silver fund returns surged to 34%-56%.
- Silver prices may rise to \$52-53/oz, with a possible jump to \$58-62/oz.
- Silver demand in 2024 (1,219 million oz) was much higher than supply (1,003.8 million oz), mainly due to industrial use (60%).

- Beta shows how much your fund moves compared to the market.
- Beta = 1: Moves the same as the market.
- Beta > 1: Moves more than the market → higher ups & downs.
- Beta < 1: Moves less than the market → more stable.

#### **Quick Meaning:**

- High Beta = High Risk, High Return
- Low Beta = Low Risk, Steady Return
